Next General Meeting

BIG NEWS: General Meeting March 25 at 1:30 p.m. via ZOOM. This is what you need to know:

To participate in the meeting, you will need a smart phone, an iPad/tablet, or a computer with both a microphone and video.

You will receive an email that includes a link to the meeting (in the example that follows the link is highlighted in yellow). All you need to do is click on that link. You DO NOT need to download or sign into Zoom. Depending on what device you are using, you may get to the meeting differently.

You may see a screen that says, "Join Meeting", so click on that.

On some devices you may see "Start a Meeting", and a smaller box at the top of the screen that says, "Open Zoom Meetings". If the small box does not appear, click on Start a Meeting. Click on Open Zoom Meetings.

If you are using a smart phone, you will click on the numbers highlighted in aqua at the end of the invitation. If you do not have a smart phone, call the phone number (+13462487799 in the aqua highlighted section below), then enter the other numbers when prompted.

You will next see a message that tells you to wait for the host to start the meeting, or it will take you directly to the meeting if it is already started. There will probably be a message that says the host will have to admit you to the meeting, and we will do so. Your computer, iPad or phone will probably ask you if you want to use computer audio and video or may tell you that you are – and you do want to use both.

When you join the meeting, you will be muted. When you need to speak, you will need to unmute. The host has the ability to mute all participants but cannot unmute you. where is a little microphone – you may have to hunt for it – with a red line through it. Click on that and you are no longer muted.

Again, different devices handle things somewhat differently. On a computer, you may have to hover over the top or bottom of the screen to see the icons that you may use for the meeting. On an iPad, they may appear automatically. If you want to see the faces of all who are participating, you will look for an icon made of nine tiny dots, along with the word "View". Click on that box and you can change to gallery view to see all participants. Not all participants of a large meeting will show on one screen, so you can move to the next or previous screen by clicking the arrow in the mid-right or mid-left of the screen, or by swiping on your phone.

You are encouraged to sign on a little early and explore.

To sign off, click the red End button, or the host will end the meeting for all.

It is really pretty easy to use and you can 'meet' for up for forty minutes at a time with up to 100 people. You can use it to meet with your kids or have a little happy hour with friends.
